



The season of Lent is the forty days before Easter from February 26 (Ash Wednesday) to April 11 (Holy Saturday). Sundays are excluded because every Sunday is like a little Easter. Basically, it's about one-tenth of a year (like a tithe of time). Lent is the season of the Christian Year where Christians focus on simple living, prayer, and fasting in order to grow closer to God. At Jesus' baptism the sky split open, the Spirit of God, which looked like a dove, descended and landed on Him, and a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, My Beloved, with whom I am pleased." Afterward, as told in Matthew 4:1-11, Jesus was led into the wilderness by the Spirit where he fasted and prayed for 40 days and 40 nights. During his time there he was tempted three times by Satan and found clarity and strength to resist temptation. Afterwards, Jesus was ready to begin his ministry.

WRITING WOMEN BACK INTO HISTORY: In February 1980, President Jimmy Carter issued the first Presidential Proclamation declaring the week of March 8, 1980 as National Women's History Week to recognize, honor and celebrate the achievements of American women. He said, "The achievements, leadership, courage, strength and love of the women who built America was as vital as that of the men." In 1987, Congress declared March as National Women's History Month in perpetuity to honor the notable achievements of women. This month we will honor a few of these women.



Katherine Johnson, 101, died Mon., Feb. 24, 2020. A mathematician, she was one of NASA's human "computers," an unsung hero of the space agency's early days. She calculated the flight path for America's first crewed space mission and moon landing, and was among the women profiled in the book and movie *Hidden Figures*. NASA's Administrator wrote on Twitter, "The NASA family will never forget Katherine Johnson's courage and the milestones we could not have reached without her. Her story and her grace continue to

inspire the world."

Born in West Virginia in 1918., she was fascinated by numbers as a young girl, was gifted - graduated from high school at 14 and finished college with degrees in math and French from historically black West Virginia State College. She initially became a teacher but in 1953 took a job at the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics, now known as NASA. She was one of a handful of African American women hired to do computing in the guidance and navigation department at Langley's Research Center in VA. The women battled both racism and sexism. As Johnson told public television station WHRO in 2011, none of it held her back: "I just happened to be working with guys and when they had briefings, I asked permission to go. So her boss 'Let her go.'"
